Bio Dr Eiko Fried

Dr Eiko Fried graduated in Clinical Psychology at the Free University of Berlin, in close collaboration with the departments of Psychology and Psychiatry at the University of Michigan. His PhD was entitled "Covert Heterogeneity of Major Depressive Disorder: Depression Is More Than the Sum-Score of its Symptoms".

After a 2-year stay as a postdoctoral researcher at the Quantitative Psychology group at KU Leuven (Belgium), he now works at the Psychological Methods group of the University of Amsterdam.

Since 2014, Eiko has authored 27 papers, 18 of which are first author papers. His work was focused predominantly on Depression Symptomics: the study of individual depression symptoms and their network configurations. Eiko has published conceptual and empirical papers on mental disorders as complex dynamical systems (depression, bereavement, substance abuse, PTSD, generalized anxiety disorder), has written a number of tutorial papers that aim to help clinical researchers overcome statistical hurdles, and has published on the psychometrics, measurement, nosology, and ontology of mental disorders.
