

Professor Kevin Browne is Director of the Centre for Forensic and Family Psychology and holds the Chair of Forensic Psychology and Child Health at the University of Nottingham Medical School. He is currently Consultant to the European Commission, UNICEF and the World Health Organisation, following 12 years as an Executive Councillor of the International Society for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect. He has worked in more than 50 countries worldwide, to improve the care and protection of children.

In the UK, he has pioneered forensic psychology training and was the first to develop a Professional Doctorate in Forensic Psychology at Birmingham and Nottingham Universities which are three year programme for those with an Honours Degree in Psychology. With the help of Dr Shihning Chou he also developed the Nottingham Top up Professional Doctorate in Forensic Psychology which is a two year programme for those with a MSc in Forensic Psychology. The University of Nottingham programmes are run nationwide in collaboration with the Nottingham Institute for Mental Health and Rampton Hospital.
